

In 1953, he was the first to conquer – in a single-handed effort – the Nanga Parbat. In his attempt to conquer his second 8000 meter peak, the much-admired hero paid for it with his life. Hermann Buhl left a young wife and three little daughters. How did they cope with his sensational fame and his death?
