

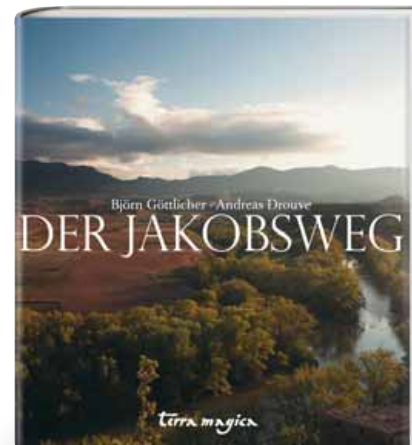
The great medieval pilgrimage is back with a vengeance, putting even popular Mediterranean beach resorts in the shade: the Way of St. James, generally known as the Camino de Santiago – almost 800 kilometres from the border between France and Spain to the destination, Santiago. A unique art and nature trail, the pilgrims' path stretches throughout northernmost Spain, from the Pyrenees all the way to Galicia. The Camino de Santiago is one vast open air museum: chapels and churches stud the hillsides like jewels, monasteries, cathedrals and fortresses boast a veritable treasure trove of art history.
