

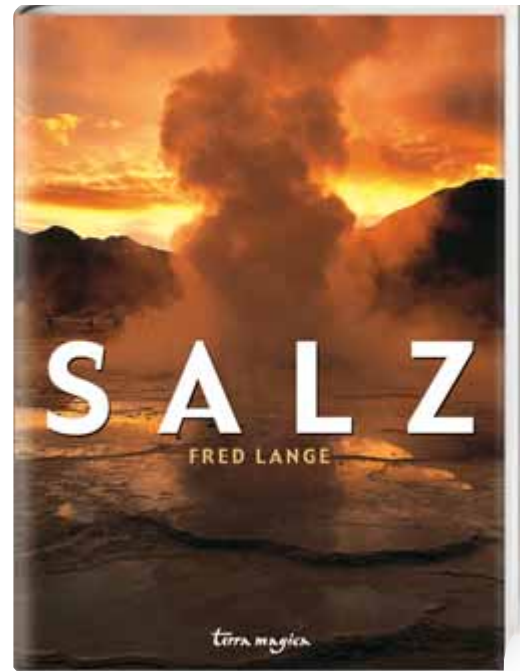
It is more precious than gold, mining and transporting it was an adventure
